








#### The University of Vienna

- Oldest university in the German-speaking world
- One of the largest in Central Europe
- 88.000 students, 9.400 employees
- 180 study programmes








#### Studying in Austria

- Admission for all students from all countries admission process rather complicated for non-EUcitizens
- Admission regulations for 3 study programmes (entrance examination)






#### SWDs: University of Vienna

- ~ 500 registered students with disabilities (0,5% of all students)
- 57% women, 43% men
- Favourite study programmes:

17%	law	(1 <sup>st</sup> )
14%	psychology	(5 <sup>th</sup> )
10%	history	(2 <sup>nd</sup> )

#### Support at the University of Vienna


Student Point: counselling

- Austrian students' Union: counselling








#### Disability officer: Tasks

- Personal Counselling
- Newsletter, website(s), mailing-lists, forum
- Coordination of disability-related projects, eg
  Student Advisory Board
- Consultancy for other university-departements








#### Topics at Consultation Disability Officer

- Organization of semester and studying
- Right of exam accomodation










#### Support: University of Vienna

- Exam accomodations
- Grant for students with disabilities (announcement 1\*/year)
- Remission of tuition fee (363€ per semester)








#### Students with visual impairments

- Adaptation of documents
- Tactile orientation system for blind students
- Accessible websites











#### Students with hearing impairments

- Induction loops in some lecture halls
- Organization of exchange of notes
- No funding of sign language interpreters, realtime captioning or note-takers










#### Students with mental health conditions

- Exam accomodations
- Psychological Counselling
  Center offers support for free
- Low awareness










### Students with Mobility Impairments

- Accessibility of buildings
- Accessible rooms in student halls
- Accessible public transport system










#### Students with Specific Learning Disabilities

- ADHD, dyslexia, Aspergers
- Low awareness
- Few support possibilities










#### Federal support system

- Personal Assistance








#### **Student Advisory Board**

- Get an insight into structure of an HEI








#### Student Advisory Board
