## Lectures on Qualitative Research

# Wednesday, May 16<sup>th</sup> 2012 at 9am, Nelson Mandela Building, Room 209, AAU

As teaching and qualification at AAU mainly focuses on quantitative or mixed methods research we were asked to share our experiences with qualitative research. Forty students and staff members participated in our lectures on qualitative research methods. We chose to present the Life Course Approach and Grounded Theory from both a theoretical as well as practical perspective by giving insights into our current research projects CLASDISA and Quali-TYDES.

After the two lectures we had a very lively discussion on intercultural issues concerning the Life Course Approach as well as problems related to the application of Grounded Theory within complex research designs.



### CBR – Workshop

# Tuesday, May 22<sup>nd</sup> 2012 at 9am, Nelson Mandela Building, Room 209, AAU See *Program of the Workshop* and *Minutes* for details.

Assessing the professional needs of CBR organizations, we invited four different groups of stakeholders:

- CBR coordinators
- Parents of children with disabilities using CBR
- Persons with disabilities/ DPOs
- Community Rehabilitation Workers (CRWs)

More than 30 participants from all over Addis Ababa and a few from outside the capital (together around 10 different organizations) joined the workshop that was opened by Professor Tirussew Teferra and moderated by Yirgashewa Bekele and Dr. Alemayehu Teklemariam Haye.

After introducing the aims of the workshop, we asked participants to discuss the following issues in four groups:

- Good practice in CBR
- Challenges faced

During the discussion session it became clear that this workshop served a very important purpose: Everybody seemed eager to exchange and was looking for a platform to discuss problems faced in the field of CBR.

After a break every group presented their findings which were discussed thoroughly. The opportunities academically based (further) education could provide, were raised as one of the core discussion points.

## Public Lectures on Quali-TYDES and CLASDISA Wednesday, May 23<sup>rd</sup> 2012 at 9am, Nelson Mandela Building, Room 209, AAU



Following our presentations of the methodological backgrounds of current research activities on May, 16<sup>th</sup> 2012 we invited interested students and staff members to get to know more about the projects themselves.

After presenting preliminary results from CLASDISA and Quali-TYDES we engaged in a very interesting discussion with an audience of around 20 persons. All in all this session lasted around 3,5 hours without break (!).
